### QUICK NOTES

#### MAC Quick Notes

Bowling Green's 27-17 win over No. 25 Pittsburgh was the Falcons fourth-ever over a non-conference ranked team. The Falcons also beat No. 16 Purdue 27-26 on Sept. 6, 2003; No. 18 Purdue on Sept. 16, 1972; and No. 12 Northern Illinois, 34-18, Oct. 25, 2003. The win was the 15th in league history by a MAC team vs. a non-conference ranked opponent.

Buffalo's 25-point margin of victory over UTEP is the largest margin of victory by UB in a non-conference game vs a I-A opponent since joining the I-A ranks in 1999. The previous was a 23-point margin in a 34-11 triumph over Rutgers in 2002.

Temple's 35-7 win over Army was the first season-opening win in three years under head coach Al Golden. The 28-point margin of victory was the program's largest vs. a I-A/FBS foe since a 48-14 triumph over Rutgers in 2000.

Central Michigan's game against No. 1 Georgia will be the seventh game in league history where a MAC opponent has been ranked No. 1. The previous contests are:

## MAC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK (SEPT. 1, 2008)

### EAST DIVISION (two honorees)

#### **Jimmy Scheidler, TE, Bowling Green**

Jr., Indianapolis, Ind. (Bishop Central)

With his team down 14 points, Scheidler caught two TD passes to spark a comeback in a 27-17 win at No. 25 ranked Pittsburgh. He grabbed a five-yard toss from Freddie Barnes, and a three-yard toss from Tyler Sheehan in a span of 6:30 in the second quarter to even the score at 14.

#### **Drew Willy, QB, Buffalo**

Sr., Randolph, N.J. (Randolph)

Willy went 10-for-16 for 221 yards, four touchdowns and no interceptions in the Bulls' win over UTEP. He had touchdown passes of 15, 68, 34 and 56 yards. His four touchdown passes were not only a career best, but was a school record for the Division I-A era. His first completion gave him the school record for career completions with 546.

### DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

#### **Kenny Lewis, DB, Bowling Green**

Sr., Pittsburgh, Pa. (Penn Hills)

Helped the Falcons down the nation's No. 25 ranked team in a 27-17 win at Pittsburgh. Lewis was credited with six tackles and had a forced fumble, a fumble recovery, an interception and a pass break up.

### SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

#### **Tommie Williams, Temple**

Sr., Spring Valley, N.Y. (St. Joseph's Regional)

Williams saw playing time as a member of the kickoff and punt units in the 35-7 win at Army. Williams had two tackles, one inside the 20 yard line. He also caused and recovered a fumble, the first of his collegiate career. Williams' fumble recovery on a punt in the first quarter led to Temple's first touchdown just three plays later.

Zombo posted a career-high 2.5 sacks in a 31-12 win over Eastern Illinois. Zombo's sacks and forced fumble late in the second quarter set up a CMU touchdown that gave the Chippewas a 17-3 lead at halftime.

### SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

#### **B.J. Hill, PR, Ball State**

Sr., Lanham, Md. (Riverdale Baptist)

Hill returned three punts for 90 yards, including a career-long 72-yard return in the second quarter. That second quarter return set up a two-yard TD run for the Cardinals that gave Ball State a 28-0 lead vs. Northeastern en route to a 48-14 win.

**MAC QUICK HITS**

**THIS WEEK'S GAMES:** MAC action gets underway Friday on ESPN at 7:00 as Ball State hosts Navy. This will be the first nationally televised game from Schuemann Stadium. The contest will feature BSU QB Nate Davis, the MAC's leader in passing efficiency the last two years; and Navy's Shun White, the Walter Camp Foundation Player of the Week for his 348 yards (on just 19 carries) in a 14-7 win last week vs. Towson.

The key game this week is the first league contest of the season when Northern Illinois and Western Michigan meet Saturday night at Waldo Stadium in Kalamazoo. The two QBs in the starting slots - NIU's Chandler Harnish and WMU's Tim Hiller - combined for 668 passing yards while completing 60 percent of their attempts last week.

Central Michigan travels to Athens, Ga., to take on the No. 1 ranked Georgia Bulldogs (FSN South, 3:30). Four MAC teams face opponents from the Big Ten with Bowling Green hosting Minnesota (ESPNU, 7:30). Three league member are on the road - Ohio at Ohio State (ESPN, Noon), Miami at Michigan (ESPN2, Noon) and Eastern Michigan at Michigan State (Big Ten Network, Noon).

Three MAC squads will face opponents from the Big East. Temple welcomes Connecticut (ESPNU, Noon); Akron is at Syracuse (FSN Ohio, 3:30 and Buffalo is at Pittsburgh (ESPN Plus/ESPN Game Plan, 6:00).

Kent State is at Big 12 foe Iowa State in a rematch from last year's season-opener; and Toledo makes its way west to challenge Arizona from the PAC 10.

**NOTING THE BULLS:** Buffalo's 25-point margin of victory over UTEP is the largest margin of victory by UB in a non-conference game vs a I-A opponent since joining the I-A ranks in 1999. The previous was a 23-point margin in a 34-11 triumph over Rutgers in 2002. After winning six total games in the 2003-2006 seasons; UB has compiled a 6-7 record in 2007 and thus far in 2008. QB Drew Willy, in the last 13 games, has 19 TD passes and six interceptions. In 2005 and 2006, he had 12 TD passes and 18 interceptions. Willy is one of seven fourth-year starting QBs in the nation at the I-A level- complete list - Rudy Carpenter, Arizona State; Curtis Painter, Purdue; Mike Teel, Rutgers; Willie Tuitama, Arizona; Drew Weatherford, Florida State; Pat White, West Virginia; Drew Willy, Buffalo.

**THE MAC AT 62:** The Mid-American Conference celebrates its 62nd year of gridiron competition and will hold its 12th championship game in 2008. This year's Marathon MAC Championship football game will be played Friday, Dec. 5, at Ford Field in Detroit. This year's title game will be the fifth played at Ford Field.

**EIGHT FOR ALL:** Unlike 2007 when MAC teams played an unbalanced schedule, each MAC school will play eight conference games in 2008. Due to seven teams compiling the East Division and six teams in the West Division, two East Division match ups will not occur [Akron vs. Miami; and Bowling Green vs. Temple]. This format is reflective of the 199 season when two East Divisions match ups also did not occur [Akron vs. Marshall; and Bowling Green vs. Buffalo] in order to facilitate an eight-game conference schedule for the 13-team league.

**SUPER SOPHS RETURN:**

The three MAC teams that went to a bowl game last year all were led by sophomore quarterbacks and each signal caller returns for 2008. Two-time defending league champion Central Michigan (Motor City Bowl) has Dan LeFevour returning to add to his career numbers of 6,683 passing yards and 53 touchdown passes. Bowling Green (GMAC Bowl) welcomes Tyler Sheehan after his first year as a starter that produced 3,123 passing yards and 23 scoring strikes. Ball State (International Bowl) will send out third-year starter Nate Davis and his numbers of 5,642 passing yards and 48 touchdown passes.

**THE BEST ARE BACK:**

Northern Illinois defensive end Larry English, voted by MAC head coaches as winner of the Vern Smith Leadership Award as a junior last year, returns to anchor the Huskie defense. English became just the second defensive player in 26 years to win the award, joining Central

Michigan linebacker Ray Bentley (1982) in that category. English is also the first non-senior since Byron Leftwich in 2001 and 2002 to win the award and to return for the next season. Coupled with Huskie running back Garrett Wolfe capturing the honor in 2006, NIU is the only school in MAC history to have different players win the award in back-to-back years. English led the MAC with 10.5 sacks last season.

In addition, MAC Defensive Player of the Year, linebacker Clayton Mullins of Miami, returns to the RedHawk defense. Mullins topped the league in tackles with 11 tackles per game while leading the RedHawks to the Marathon MAC Championship game. He also had 13 tackles for a loss.

On the other side of the ball, Offensive Player of the Year in Central Michigan quarterback Dan LeFevour is back for his junior season. LeFevour completed 355-of-543 pass attempts last year for 27 touchdowns and 3,652 yards. He led the Chippewas to their second consecutive MAC title and berth in the Motor City Bowl.

CMU also was the recipient of the Freshman of the Year talent in 2007 with Antonio Brown capturing that honor. Brown accounted for 2,267 yards of total offense and eight touchdowns (6 receiving, 1 receiving and 1 via kickoff return). His total offense yards established a league record for freshmen. Brown gained 1,003 yards on 102 receptions, 1,048 yards on 40 kickoff returns and 142 yards on 13 punt returns.

**MAC NEWS MEDIA ASSOCIATION POLL:** A record 10 teams received at least two votes to win their respective division, but in the end the MAC News Media Association preseason football poll touted Central Michigan to walk off Ford Field on Dec. 5 with another MAC trophy. The poll was announced at the league's annual Football Media day held at Ford Field in Detroit.

The Chippewas, two-time defending champion, are heavily favored to capture the West Division and the Marathon MAC Championship game, facing its toughest test from Bowling Green, tabbed to win the MAC East Division in a tight race over Miami.

Six squads received votes for the question of capturing the championship game. Central Michigan had 24 votes, with the other split among Ball State (5), Bowling Green (4), Buffalo (1), Miami (1) and Western Michigan (1).
